New Wi-Fi Assisted-Listening System



The Racial Justice Arc (RJA) invites you to participate in a small-group reading and discussion of *Me and White Supremacy: Combat Racism, Change the World, and Become a Good Ancestor* by Layla F. Saad. The book and associated journal prompts encourage readers to understand their white privilege and their participation in white supremacy. While all are welcome to participate in these circles, Saad cautions that, "This work takes a considerable emotional labor toll of BIPOC, and the work is not for them to do – it is for people with white privilege to do." With that noted, the group facilitators will work to make this a safe space for all who choose to participate.

Food Justice: More Good News on Plant-Based Diets

Did you know plant-based eating is a great way to lose weight? However, it's not a diet you do for a few weeks

to achieve this result, it's a permanent change to your eating habits. Avoid eating meat, eggs, and dairy products and instead eat plant-based foods—vegetables, grains, beans, and fruits. This way of eating has many health benefits, such as lowering cholesterol, which reduces the risk of heart disease, and improving insulin sensitivity, which decreases the risk of diabetes.
